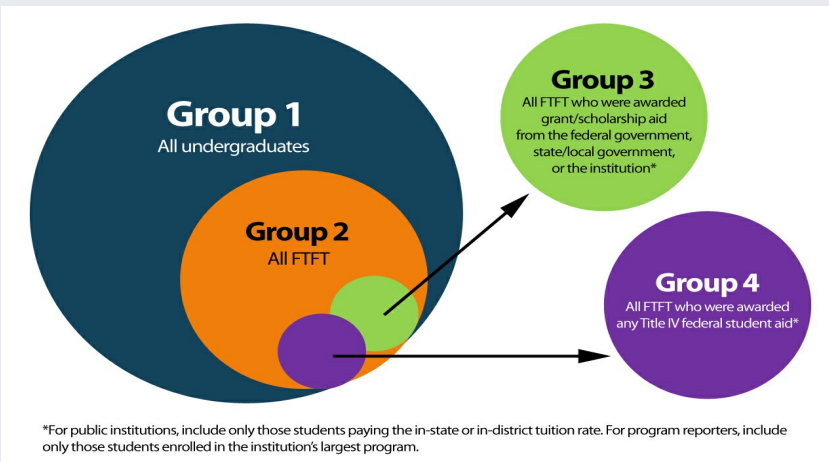

**COA Revisions**


